Mentoring

Each student will be provided a staff mentor. Students typically meet with their mentors monthly. Students are encouraged to reach out to their mentors whenever they have a problem or just want to talk. Students can rely on their mentors for encouragement, advice and problem-solving.

3. Computer Use

Computer use is always at the discretion/direction of the teacher. Students are not permitted to send or display offensive messages or pictures, change desktop settings, damage equipment, or be on unauthorized sites.

4. Dress Code

Appropriate dress is important in creating a good atmosphere. Eagle Academy follows the High School Dress code. Consult the High School Handbook for the complete dress code for students.

5. Electronics

Student use of phones in in the classroom is always at the direction and discretion of the teacher. This may change from class to class or day to day. When not in use, phones should be stored in a purse, book bag or pocket, not on the desk.

6. Transitioning back to EHT High school

Students are encouraged to transition back to the high school if they choose. Good grades, good attendance and good behavior are required. Most transitions occur at the end of the academic year.

7. Students Driving to School

Students may drive to school with the permission of the school director and completion of the Student Driver Agreement. Please talk with Mr. Smith if you would like to drive to school. Space is limited.

8. Drug Screens

Random Drug screens may be given at any time. Successful drug screens are required for work programs and for transitioning back to the High School.

9. Bathroom Policy

Bathroom passes will be given out during the last 10 minutes of each class period. Exceptions will be made for emergencies. Bathrooms may be closed to students during the change of classes.

10. Participation at High School Events

Eagle Academy students may participate in all High School clubs, sports & after school activities. Transportation to the High School

for after school events will be provided for. Please let Mrs. Bowker know. Participation at all high school events is dependent on a student's behavior.

11. Attendance

An Excused absence is an absence for one or more of the following reasons: 1. The pupil's illness (Parent notes will not be accepted to excuse an absence. The student must provide a note from a physician to excuse the absence.) 2. Family illness or death 3. Educational opportunities 4. Excused religious observances 5. The pupils suspension from school 6. The pupil's required attendance in court 7. Interviews with a prospective employer or with an admissions officer 8. Examination for a driver's license 9. Necessary and unavoidable medical or dental appointments. *Appropriate documentation must be provided to excuse any absence.*

12. Late Policy

Students are counted as tardy or "late" if they arrive after 8:45. Students are allowed 5 lates per quarter. A detention will be assessed for each late after that. Students may not order breakfast or be admitted to first period class if they arrive past 9:00.

13. No-Credit Status

- A. Students who accumulate more then 10 unexcused absences will be on no-credit status.
- B. Students on no-credit status will ineligible for trips, sports, clubs and student stipends.
- C. Students may attend credit-recovery sessions to regain credit.
- D. Credit recovery is not available to students who have been absent more than 35 total days.

14. Make-up work

Students absent for any reason are expected to make up the work missed. The pupil is responsible for requesting, completing and submitting missed assignments.
